

Our Treasurer, Adrian Zirps have provided the following pages on the income and expenses generated over the last 12 months.




#### Income






#### Expenses





#### **Profit and loss**







#### Education

This issue continues to be the most important area of concern for our profession.

#### **AHSCA Education Report**

It has been a difficult year in for education for hydraulic services with TAFE QLD formally announcing that they will not continue with delivering the Diploma in Hydraulic Services Design. After successful completion of the teach our cohort and many follow up meetings towards the end of 2022, that was a disappointing start to the year. Furthermore TAFE QLD have also confirmed that the previous course material has no worth to them but at the same time they are unwilling to share their Diploma course material. This is an ongoing issue that will have to remain on next year's committee agenda with Master Plumbers QLD providing support and lobbying the QLD government to put further pressure on TAFE QLD to release that course material so industry can review and negotiate with other RTOs on delivering the Diploma.

TAFE NSW are continuing to deliver the Diploma but are also struggling with teacher and course material resourcing. 34 students are currently enrolled with 3 QLD members who are due to complete the Diploma in 2024.

Given these ongoing issues around the Diploma in hydraulic design the attached discussion paper has been written to summarise the issues and to put forward an industry led long term solution. This has been reviewed and endorsed by the other AHSCA state chapters and also circulated to all Masterplumber state chapters in the different states and territories. We would like to thank all QLD and other state chapter members that had provided input in putting together this discussion paper. While this paper does not necessarily resolve the short term issues with QLD students obtaining formal qualifications so they can become QBCC licensed, it is the first step in developing a long term solution on a national level to formalise education across all states and territories and different plumbing industry sectors (i.e. plumbers, designers, teachers, inspectors, etc.)



#### AHSCA Education Report (cont.)

On a more positive note, we had another round of QLD members obtain the performance based stormwater design qualifications providing our members with an opportunity to deliver cost effective design solutions to their clients outside the AS3500.3 limitations.

We have also received information that TAFE NSW are looking to open another round of enrolments for their Diploma in Hydraulic services design course. While no enrolments can currently be registered via the NSW website, all members interested in completing the Diploma course are encouraged to send through their expression of interest.

In the meantime, the following courses are currently available for hydraulic designers:

CERT IV in Hydraulic Services (Design), on-line at TAFE QLD. This is a pre-requisite to the hydraulic services diploma and any plumbers who hold the CERT IV in Hydraulic Services (Operational) still require to complete the design specific course units.

Diploma of Fire Systems Design, on-line at Pacific Institute of Technology. This course includes fire hydrant, hose reel and sprinkler design modules which can be cross credited to the hydraulic services Diploma. Completion of this diploma is also a pre-requisite for design certification of hydrant and hose reel systems in NSW and fire sprinkler systems in QLD and NSW. Other states are likely to follow suit in the near future.
